The Fine Arts Departments (Art and Music) at Moravian College focus on providing students with a quality fine arts education that includes the appropriate combination of cultural activities, and experiential learning. Students are taught to use art as a medium for expression.

ART

The Department of Art at Moravian provides students with a curriculum rooted in liberal arts, preparing them for careers in graphic/interactive design, studio art, art education, and art history. Working as artists, scholars, designers, historians, animators, museum curators, and teachers, graduates combine technical and conceptual excellence with a deep understanding of the role of art in today's world.

MUSIC

The Department of Music at Moravian offers a comprehensive curriculum of training in the theory, history, and performance of diverse styles. This study, integrating intellectual, artistic, and personal growth in a liberal arts context, prepares students for careers as choral directors, music therapists, performers, music administrators, music researchers, music instructors, and composers.

FACILITIES

Many advanced students are provided with private studios for individual work and independent study. All studios are open 24 hours a day. The Priscilla Payne Hurd Center for Music and Art includes an advanced photo lab; a fully equipped ceramics lab; and a graphic design lab with networked Power Macintosh workstations, color and black-and-white scanning and printing equipment, a digital camera, and many other advanced features for computer-assisted design. Facilities are available for jewelry and metalsmithing and printmaking. The Payne Gallery mounts outstanding national and international exhibits. In addition, the Hurd Center for Music and Art includes three performance halls. Hearst Hall, formerly the 1848 Chapel, with seating capacity of 80, is used for harpsichord performances and recitals. Formerly the 1867 Chapel, Peter Hall is used for choral rehearsals and recitals, and has a seating capacity of 180. Foy Concert Hall is a modern 425-seat facility designed specifically to accommodate musical performance.

Music majors may be elected to the College's Chapter of Delta Omicron, an international music honor society; and have an opportunity to participate in the College's various ensembles including the Choir, Women's Chorus, Vocalis, Moravian College-Community Orchestra, Wind Ensemble, Contemporary Ensemble, Instrumental and Vocal Chamber Ensembles, Early Music Ensembles, Jazz Ensembles, Marching Band & Color Guard, and Basketball Pep Band.
